Pittsburgh April 5th 1859

I left Pittsburgh this morning on my route to California. Come down to Wellsville, and there met my companions; rigged our waggons bought our cooking utensils etc.,

Thursday Morning- shipped on the steamer Paris- and descended the Ohio river, full of hope and with golden ambition. Toward evening our number was bught rented, by one of the Dutch women on deck giving birth to a boy, and our sport was much increased at the idea of Doc being called to deliver her of her burden of nature.

Friday 9th. This morning we discover on awakening a delightful morning the first town on our route this morning is the grand town known by the title of Gallipolis, proverbial for ugly girls and indolent men. During the day we passed Portsmouth & Maysville. This day was passed off very quietly & pleasantly I now quit writing to go to bed.

Saturday 10th. This morning I find myself at the Cincinatti wharf. Here we find a splendid city, and a noble and hospitable people. About eleven o'clock our lines are cast off and the next minute we are gliding smoothly o'er the vaters of the majestic Ohio. During the day we pass some of the most beautiful farms and dwelling houses that I ever beheld. Toward evening we arrived at Madison a beautiful small town on the Indianna shore. Night stops our view.

Sunday 11th. This morning upon wakening I find myself at the Port of Louisville. The town is overflowed to a considerable distance with water. The water stands some four or five feet on the houses along Water street- Portland, a small town below Louisville, a portion of which is entirely covered with water.

Monday 12th. I made very few observations today from the fact that I have been very unwell. However I saw the town of Evansville, and a large body of land below, on the Kentucky shore entirely overflowed by water.

Tuesday 13th. This morning I found myself sailing up the Mississippi. I took little notice of the country being still unwell.

Wednesday 14th. Nothing of importance today, till evening we arrived at St. Louis.

Thursday 15th. Still lying at St. Louis. Reshipped on to the El Paso, for St. Joe; your humble servant still quite unwell.

Friday 16th. Wet and disagreeable unwell still. Left St. Louis this evening. Continue sick all the way to St. Joe. Lay sick at the Missouri Hotel 12 days; feeling considerable better on tuesday the 4th May. I shipped in one of the wagons and started for the plains. We only went 4 miles, and had to pitch our tent and wait till the next day on account of the Ferry being so throng that we could not get across the river.

Wednesday 5th. Crossed the river about noon, drove out four miles & encamped for the night.

Thursday 6th. Advanced about 12 miles through some beautiful country but destitute of timber.

Friday 7th. Travelled finely, it being a beautiful day, I got out for the first time and rode the pony for a considerable distance.

Saturday. About the same as the day before. In the evening about 50 miles from St. Joe, we encamped until Monday.

Sunday 9th. Changing our mind we moved on about 6 miles, so that we would be able to reach a good camping ground next evening.

Monday 10th. Started early and done a big days travelling, forenoon pleasant, but afternoon very wet and disagreeable.

Tuesday 11th. This morning two wagons from our crowd turned back, belonging to a man by the name of Richardson. His difficulty was sickness. His family first were cut down with the measles, then they took the vareloid.

This morning his wife being sick, discourages him and he concludes to return. There is great sympathy for him in the company. This afternoon Adam took quite sick, caused I think by too heavy eating. This morning we crossed the big Nemaha creek.

Wednesday 12th. This morning is beautiful, Adam is considerably better. About 8 o'clock we crossed the little Nemaha creek. About 2 o'clock we crossed Elm creek, and encamped about a mile beyond. This evening I eat some chicken soup made of a prairie hen.

Thursday 13th. A dry pleasant day but very windy. We made a very good days

travelling.

Friday 14th. This morning is clear and beautiful. About 9 o'clock, we crossed the big blue creek, a beautiful stream, larger than Chartiers.

Saturday 15th. A cloudy morn, soon commences to rain, the wind high, broke our wagon twice the tire and hounds.

Sunday 18th. Very cold and stormy, leave our camp about 9 o'clock to hunt a better one and travel about 9 miles.

Monday 17th. A very pleasant day, no new observations.

Tuesday 18th. Clear, but a little windy and dusty, reached little Blue in the morning, and travelled along it all day. Grass very scarce.

Wednesday 19th. Travel all day along on the north side of the little Blue grass very scarce: ground poor but very pleasant weather; roads dasty.

Thursday 20th. Delightful morning. At noon we left little Blue after following it about 48 miles. Afternoon wet and rather cool.

Friday 21st. Very wet and disagreeable; lay late in camp; then started and travelled about 8 miles, then stopped for dinner. Veather cold enough almost for snow.

Saturday 22d. Rain ceased, but still very cold; afternoon very pleasant. Camped in sight of Fort Kearny.

Sunday 23d. Most delightful day, lay all day on the banks of the Platte river, and in sight of Fort Kearny. Wood scarce. Eat dinner at Fort Kearny. Wrote home. Monday 24th. Fine morning, made a big drive today; the roads very good.

Tuesday 25th. Raining a little, but in a short time cleared away; day fine. Wednesday 26th. All things passed off well.

Thursday 27th. Cool in the morning, but extremely warm through the day. Friday 28th. Day similar to the day before. We arrived at the first Ford of the Platte river in the evening, and camped on the south side.

Saturday 29th. Early in the morning we crossed the south fork of the Platte river. River shallow; Ford very good.

Sunday 30th. Travelled some five or six miles; day very pleasant.

Monday 31st. Ascended the ridge and followed it till noon then descended into the flat again.

Tuesday, <u>June 1st. 1852</u>. Weather especially warm, & the roads very dusty, in the afternoon, we passed through Ashhollow, and camped in the flat below.

Wednesday 2d. Morning cloudy, but day warm; roads most desperate dusty.

Thursday 3d. Morning cool, day throughout pleasant.

Friday 4th. Day pleasant, and roads good. This day we passed the Church or Court house bluff, it is a high stack of rocks, about 10 miles to the left of the road, but so high as to be seen distinctly from the road, it is said to be 300 feet high.

Saturday 5th. This morning, we passed Chimney rock. This rock is a beautiful

specimen of the works of nature. The basement covers about 6 acres of ground, then ascends with a gradual slope, about 200 feet in diameter, & 75 or 100 feet

in height.

Sunday 6th. Teather cool, and roads good. At noon we passed Scotts bluffs. These bluffs are the most splendid, that I ever beheld. From the base to the top of the rock appears to be near 500 feet; on the side fronting the road the rocks rise almost perpendicular. The road runs through between the bluffs, and is difficult to pass.

Monday 7th. Day quite cool, very pleasant for driving; roads very good.

Tuesday 8th. Passed two Indian trading posts. Crossed the middle fork of the Platte river, and camped in sight of Fort Larimer. Wrote three letters; one home.

Wednesday 9th. Six hundred and thirty miles from St. Joe, & five weeks out today. All well.

Thursday 10th. Crossed Bitter Cottonwood Creek, dry cottonwood & made a big days drive.

Friday 11th. Crossed Horseshoe Creek, in the afternoon, the roads are very rough.

Saturday 12th. Crossed Labonte river in the forenoon, day pleasant. Roads rough.

Sunday 15th. Morning very cool-in the forenoon we crossed Saprelle river, in the afternoon, we crossed little Deer Creek.

Monday 14th. Camped all day on the banks of little Deer Creek. One of our company (John Rhea), is sick.

Tuesday 15th. Still we rest on the banks of Deer Creek. Our company killed three deers & 6 sage hens today.

Wednesday 16th. This morning, we leave our camp & take the road again. We crossed Big Deer Creek, this morning.

Thursday 17th. This day at noon we crossed the north fork of the Platte river by Ferry & had to pay \$8 & swim our cattle.

Friday 18th. Left the Platte river and drove all day through a barren country, destitute of wood & grass, and almost of water.

Saturday 19th. This morning, we yoked our cattle, and started before day from the fact that pasture was minus; our cattle became very sick from drinking alkaline water. This evening we reached Sweet Water river, where we encamped.

Sunday 20th. This morning, after travelling about 2 miles, we reached Independence rock. This rock is rather a curiosity, it lies out in the open prarie, is about three or four hundred yards in length & about 150 feet in height. At noon we passed by the Devils Gate. The Sweetwater river passes through this gate. The walls on each side are perpendicular & about 400 feet in height. At noon, we encamped until Monday.

Monday 21st. Continued up Sweetwater, and encamped in the evening near the Devil's Gate.

Tuesday 22d. Leaving camp this morning, we leave the river to the right for a distance of 6 miles, when we come to a ford, but did not cross on account of the ford being crowded with wagons, but bearing to the left we travelled over 9 miles of desperate sandy roads. The mountains on our right are capped with a large amount of snow.

Wednesday 23d. Wet & muddy. Left camp about 3 o'clock, this morning & drove 12 miles, before breakfast, on account of alkaline water. Camping very poor.

Thursday 24th. Leaving the river we ascend the bluffs, which are steep and rough. Today I travelled over a large pile of snow. The mountains are covered with snow. The top of which seem enrobed in with the clouds.

Friday 25th. This morning we leave the Sweetwater for the last time, and travelling 10 miles, we enter the pass of the Rocky mountains, which is 2 miles in length, & 20 wide. The water now flows toward the Pacific.

Saturday 26th. We are now within 7 miles of the fords of the Salt Lake and cut-off roads. On arriving at the forks of the road, the company unanimously agree to take the Salt Lake road.

Sunday 27th. Ferguson Biggs being sick, we agree to lay up until Monday. Two of our wagons (Sm th & Smulls) left the train the train this morning on account of some small provocation.

Monday 28th. This morning we left Big Sandy Creek & travelled over about 30 miles of a desert to Green river where we encamped for the night.

Tuesday 29th. This morning we crossed Green river by the Ferry & commenced descending the river, & after travelling about 25 miles, we encamped on Ham's fork.

Wednesday 30th. After ascending this creek about 4 miles and cross it, we take the bluff, and travel about 16 miles and encamp on Mud creek. Camping poor.

Thursday 1st. Leaving Mud creek, we ascend the bluffs and travel 20 miles to Fort Eridger. Passed the Fort in the afternoon, and encamped 2 miles west of it on the mountains.

Friday 2d. We are now 110 miles, from Salt Lake City. All in good spirits & a pleasant morn. Mosquitoes very bad. At noon we passed the Copper Springs. In the afternoon we crossed the mountains dividing the waters of the Colorado, from the waters of California bay, and camped on a small stream one mile east of Bear river.

Saturday 3d. This morning we crossed Bear river, the fording was rough and difficult, the river being divided into 4 branches. We saw numerous Indians with whom we traded for venison. In the evening we encamped in Echo valley 60 miles west of Salt Lake.

Sunday 4th. This morning I met with an old friend, from Washington (Tom Morrow), We travelled down Echo valley about 16 miles to Red fork Creek & encamped on the western shore.

Monday 5th. Leaving the creek, we ascend the bluffs; roads rough & Indians numerous, encamped on the summit of a high & barren mountain. The surrounding mountains are covered with snow.

Tuesday 6th. This morning, grass being scarce, we drive about 4 miles, before breakfast, to hunt grass; in the afternoon, we arrived at Salt Lake City. Located in Salt Lake Valley. The City is extensively laid out, but the buildings are thinly located, and are built principally of sun dried brick. The inhabitants appear to possess a great deal of hospitality.

Wednesday 7th. Morning quite warm. We rest all day in the city to get our oxen shod.

Thursday 8th. We leave town at noon, and drove out 10 miles camping poor. Passed the Hot Spring.

Friday 9th. Day pleasant, drove about 10 miles only, in order to rest our cattle. Weather very warm.

Saturday 10th. Morning fair. Travelled about 12 miles, and nooned on Weber river. Crossed the same in the afternoon and camped on the eastern shore.

Sunday 11th. Lay all day on the banks of Weber river, to wait for our train, which was behind one day.

Monday 12th. This morning we crossed Ogden river and proceeded from there about 20 miles.

Tuesday 13th. The mosquitoes are very bad this morning, about 10 o'clock, we crossed Box Elder Creek. Soon after the Pony threw me off, hurting me considerably.

returning Californians. Encamped in the evening with another company.

Wednesday 4th. Morning wet, roads sandy and heavy. Camped about 100 miles above the sink.

Thursday 5th. Morning wet. We have to drive over 22 miles without grass or water reached the river about 6 o'clock and camped without grass.

Friday 6th. Today we have an other drive of 20 miles without grass. Found

tolerable good grass in the evening.

Saturday 7th. 20 miles from the big Meadow this morning. Stopped for the night 4 miles above the Meadow. In the evening we had a quarrel between Old Wily & and Billy Marsh, in which pistols were brought out, but the company prevented them from using them.

Sunday 8th. Fine morning . Drove 5 miles & stopped until Monday to make our hay for the desert.

Monday 9th. Loadened our hay and travelled about 15 miles to the lake , the nearest camping to the desert. About 8 or 9 miles from the desert wells.

Tuesday 10th. Started early and drove to the desert where we lay until 2 o'clock, then started across to Carson river where we arrived at 8 o'clock next morning.

Wednesday 11th. After resting 3 or 4 hours, we drove up the river about 6 miles and stopped until next morning.

Thursday 12th. We drive about 6 miles, and stop to pasture. Thence 14 miles and encamp for the night.

Friday 13th. This morning Biggs Gaston & myself start ahead of the teams, contending to foot it through (150 miles). The first day we travel about 40 miles.

Saturday 14th. Travelled 6 miles before breakfast, then 6 miles farther & we come to Golden Kenyon, where we saw them dig and wash gold for the first time. Then we crossed a 10 mile desert. Then travelling 2 miles we crossed an 8 mile desert. Then encamped.

Sunday 15th. Travelled 10 miles before breakfast, passed the Old Mormon Station, thence travelled 8 miles bost grub and cooked our own dinner. From thence we travelled to the mouth of the Canyon which runs through the Sierra Nevada Mountains where we encamped.

Monday 16th. This morning we start up the Canyon over the steepest and roughest road between St. Joe & California. Travelled 22 miles to mountain lake and encamped for the night. At noon we passed red lake near the top of the mountain.

Tuesday 17th. This morning we passed over the main ridge of the mountain, the summit of which is 9,000 feet above the level of the sea, and covered with perpetual snow. On the road we saw the track of a large grizzly bear, but did not see the bear itself. This day we travelled over 40 miles and encamped 33 miles east of Hang town.

Wednesday 18th. This morning we leave camp creek 33 miles from Hang town, travel 23 miles from Hang town, travel 23 miles, and stopped till next day.

Thursday 19th. We proceed to Hang town, and in the afternoon bought mining tools and commenced work, only made 50 cents.

Friday 20th. This morning I feeling unwell did not go to the mines. My partners went however, and took out the large sum of one dollar.

Saturday 21st. Mining again, our gold this evening amounts to \$2.25 cents.

Sunday 22d. Lay in the house all day.

Monday 23d. Tried mining again, but made nothing.

Tuesday 24th. 'lade \$2.50 cents.

Wednesday 25th Made 50 cents in the forenoon and quit.

hursday 26th. Sold our tools and left Hang town to go to the Volcano.

Travelled about half way (to the forks of the MaCosma river) and found my old friends at Gilmore & Hedge. Where I stopped.
